

# How to edit a wide slideshow

## Cropping your photos

If you have already cropped your photos, jump to the [updating your slideshow instructions](#).

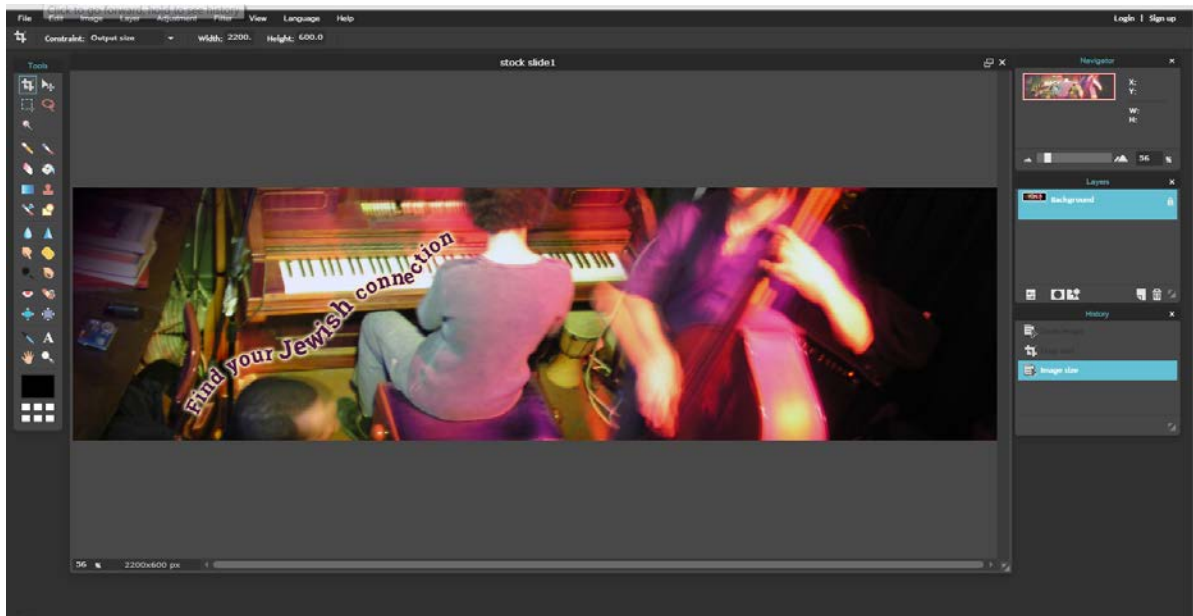
1. You will need two versions of your photo for a wide slideshow. A desktop version that is 2200px wide and 600px tall. A mobile version that is 600px wide and 500px tall.
2. Open your photo in Pixlr.



3. Choose the crop tool. Set constraint to: Output Size. Set the width to 2200. Set the height to 600. Drag the cursor to the area you want to crop your photo.



4. Click enter. The photo will be cropped to 2200px by 600px. Save photo as a separate name.



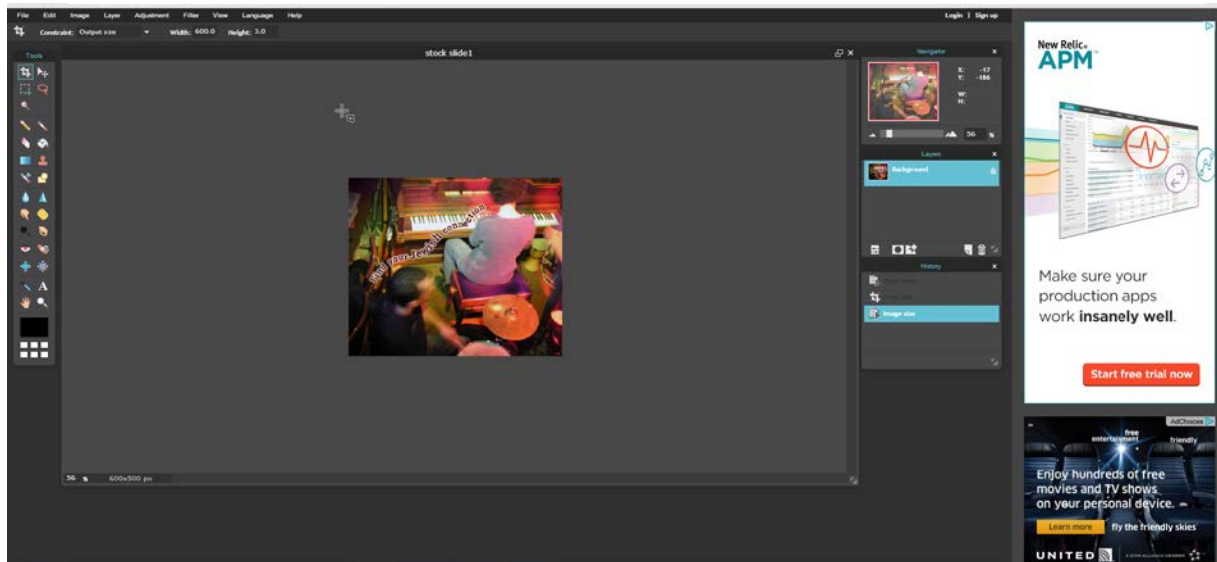
5. To crop the mobile version of the photo, open the original photo again.



6. Choose the crop tool. Set constraint to: Output Size. Set the width to 600. Set the height to 500. Drag the cursor to the area you want to crop your photo.



7. Click enter. The photo will be cropped to 600px by 500px. Save photo as a separate name.

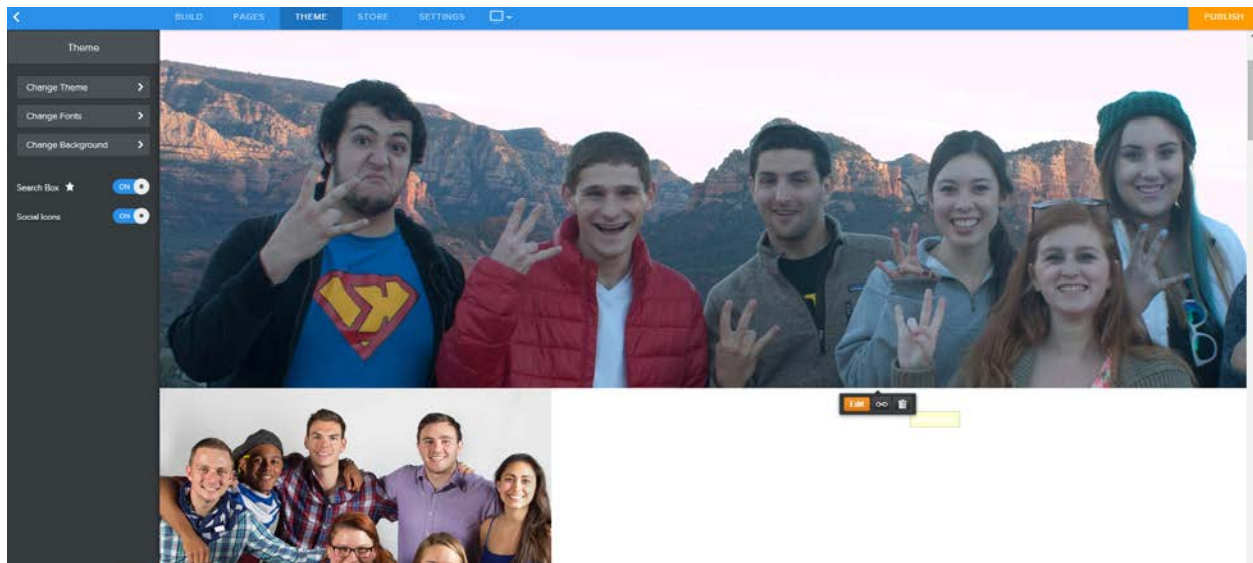




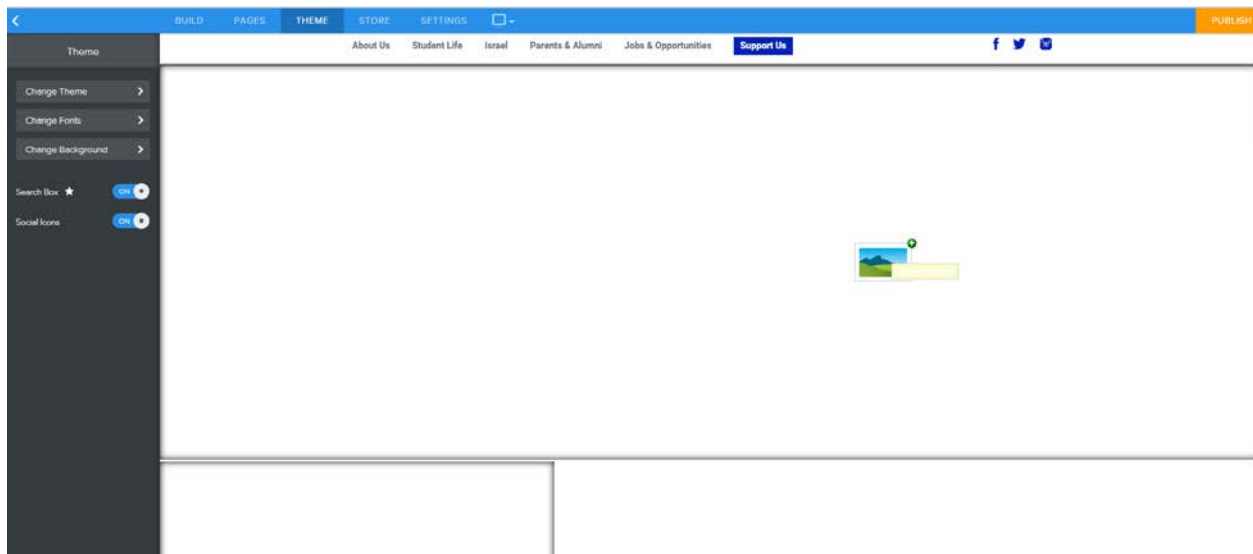
## Updating your slideshow

If you haven't cropped your photos yet, jump to the [cropping your photos instructions](#).

1. The wide slideshow has two boxes. The first box is for the desktop photo (the 2200px by 600px image). The second one is for the mobile photo (the 600px by 500px image).
2. Delete any old photos in your slideshow by hovering over the image and clicking on the trash icon.



3. Click on the image icon. A dialog box will appear where you can choose your photo.



4. Repeat the same process for the mobile photo. Click on the colored bar to type your caption. Click Publish in the upper right hand corner to make page live.
